



The City of Manistee Fire Department was established in 1873. Construction on the current station began in October of 1888, completed in June of 1889 at a cost of \$7,516.00. The station opened its doors at that time with Manistee's First "Fire Truck," a horse-drawn steam engine. Since then the personnel and apparatus have changed, but most of the fire station has not. The station is well into its 126th year of continuous service. It is known to be the oldest continuously manned fire station in the State of Michigan. The City of Manistee Fire Department provides Fire Suppression, Advanced Life Support Ambulance coverage, Technical Rescue, Fire Inspections, and Fire Safety Education to the citizens of the City.
